Complementary Area - Procedure

- communicate with the lecturer or person in charge of the module prior to the start of courses to ensure that participation is possible
- fill out the form for 'Modulanmeldung'
- have it signed by the lecturer of the course and submit the original form to the Office of Academic Affairs before the deadline for course registration

Modules and Courses

- Modules consist of 1 or 2 courses
- Modules and courses must be registered and, if necessary, de-registered.
 - Via Campus Management
 - By submitting the module registration form to the Office of Academic Affairs at the Department of History and Cultural Studies
- A module examination must be successfully completed for each module
 - Module examinations can be written examinations, term papers, presentations and combinations of these.
 - If necessary, the student must decide in which course the module examination is to be taken.

REGISTER FOR MODULES (COURSES)

- Campus Management: Select module > Select course
- Paper form: Print the registration form > Collect signatures > Submit to the Office of Academic Affairs

CANCEL MODULES (COURSES)

- Campus Management: Select module > Select course > Withdraw from course.
- Paper form: Print the withdrawal form > Sign the form > Submit to the Office of Academic Affairs

CHANGE REGISTRATION


- Campus Management: Cancel module/course > Select new module > Select course > Register for course


